Richard Sit, a Charge Technologist for the NHS Kidney Care Program, plays an important role in achieving one of the program's goals: Increasing the number of patients performing their dialysis at home independently.

Understanding that this can sometimes be unsettling for patients and their families, Richard makes himself available at any time to offer reassurance and technical support.
