WHY YOU SHOULD BE CONCERNED

- You may be infected with Hepatitis C and not know it.
- Hepatitis C may show no symptoms for years

POSSIBLE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF HEPATITIS C

- Chronic Fatigue (Tiredness all the time)
- Body aches
- Dry, itchy skin
- Inability to concentrate, forgetfulness or confusion
- Jaundice (yellowing of skin or whites of the eyes)

Provides comprehensive medical work-up before initiation of Hepatitis C treatment.

Provide education to the clients and their families before, during and after treatment.

Provide medical management during Hepatitis C treatment and referrals as needed.

Provide a multi-disciplinary approach to care to address emotional, mental and physical health.

Education regarding tobacco management through health teaching and connecting to services that may assist the individual with smoking cessation.

Provides counselling services for people with Hepatitis C and / or their families.

Provides individual / group intake and ongoing assessment.

Facilitates ongoing psycho-socialeducational support groups before, during and post Hepatitis C treatment.

Monitors patient progress while maintaining a supportive relationship with patient and family.

Consults with and refers to various community agencies on the behalf of clinic patients.

Participates in community planning and development activities in relation to Hepatitis C.

Offering & providing service in both individual and group formats; advocacy for clients as necessary.

Personalized, individual support before, during and after Hepatitis C treatment.

Emotional support and assistance in understanding the meaning and impact of medical tests and procedures.

Case management as part of a holistic approach to Hepatitis C treatment; making sure the basic needs of each individual are met.

Providing Hepatitis C education about prevention and treatment to individuals as well as community agencies.

Harm reduction approach to substance use; meeting the individual with a non-judgmental approach.
