The main entrance will include a designated drop off area for patients, while encouraging safety and usability for pedestrians. The Community Plaza will be a multi-use space that will include opportunities for community engagement and act as a courtyard to the Main Entrance.

As an environment promoting physical and mental well-being for users, this terrace will encourage nature viewing through plant material, an opportunity for social interaction and a calming atmosphere for relaxation.

These outdoor spaces will be designed to maximize greenery, promote social interaction and tranquility and stimulate the senses. The space will have seating areas, walkways, and provide a safe and secure environment.
