Whether you are an NH staff, a student or a member the community conducting research or quality improvement work to support A Healthier Niagara, we want to hear from you! The presentation of research and quality improvement through a poster is one of the many ways in which you can enrich your academic and work experience.

How to Participate

All interested poster presenters must submit an abstract. The abstract should describe original research or quality improvement work that has been conducted in Niagara or has relevance to improving the health of our community. Deadline

The deadline for abstract submission is **Wednesday, March 22nd**. Applicants will receive a decision notification via email on or before **Thursday, April 6th**.

What Is A Poster Presentation?

A research poster summarizes your research or quality improvement project in a concise and visually appealing way. It helps to publicize your work and generates productive discussion about methods, findings and implications. The poster itself is usually a mixture of brief text combined with tables, graphs and pictures to capture key aspects of the project.

Poster sessions are a great way to tell others about your research or quality improvement, in a format that is informal and highly interactive. It also allows you to connect with other students, professionals and researchers with similar interests.

Is My Study A Good Fit For The Poster Session?

Posters can report research or quality improvement work that is either in-progress or has been completed. There are no restrictions on the types of studies that can be presented however we are looking for work that aligns with our goal of A Healthier Niagara.

What Will Happen After An Abstract Is Accepted?

Details for formatting and presenting your poster will be shared when you receive the decision notification about your abstract.

Poster Submission Details & Process

Posters must be submitted using our [electronic poster submission form](#). When completing this form, you will be required to include the following information:

Author Information:

- *Corresponding Author First Name,*
- *Corresponding Author Last Name,*
- *Corresponding Author Email*
- *Corresponding Author Organization/Affiliation*
- *Additional Author(s) Name(s) and Affiliation(s)*

Poster Presentation Information:

- *Submission Title*
- *Background and Objectives (75 word limit)*
- *Approach (100 word limit)*
- *Results (125 word limit)*
- *Conclusions (50 word limit)*

You will also be required to select which two themes best represent your poster presentation:

- Community & Public Health Research
- Health Economics & Healthcare Resource Utilization
- Health Human Resources
- Medical Education
- Implementation of Best Practices
- Innovations in Care
- Quality Improvement
- Patient Experience and Patient Engagement
- Patient Safety
- Primary Care Research

Planning for Your Poster

We encourage you to start thinking about your poster well in advance. While there are no rules for creating the different sections of your poster, we suggest that it should contain the following sections and/or information:

- Title (with authors and affiliations)
- Introduction / Background
- Objectives / Aims / Goal / Problem
- Approach/Methods
- Results
- Conclusions
- References
