Niagara Health seeks a highly motivated physician with a passion for providing the highest quality care, to join the Department of Oncology to provide specialty care in the field of palliative medicine for the Niagara Region.

The physician, through the palliative care clinic, would act as a team member to provide direct care for outpatients enrolled at Walker Family Cancer Centre both urgently and through scheduled visits. The palliative care physician would oversee the palliative treatment plan. Some visits would be virtual. The focus would be on early identification of palliative care needs, advance care planning, pain and symptom management, crisis planning and avoidance of unnecessary emergency visits and admissions, community coordination and navigation, identifying and directing end of life care, and post-discharge visits with the goal of integrating inpatient and outpatient palliative care to meet ongoing needs. Whenever possible, emphasis will be on seamlessly transitioning palliative care services from the clinic to expanding resources in the community. The successful candidate would demonstrate great skills in collaborative patient management and working in a team.

Academic appointment in the Departments of Family Medicine or Medicine at McMaster University will be highly encouraged. Opportunities would exist for teaching of both medical students and residents.
