






Patient Education Binder

- Ask for help if you feel weak, dizzy or short of breath














Who is my team?










Your Symptoms Matter

Tell us your symptoms so we can help.

- Complete the symptom assessment at home before each doctor visit
- It tells us how you are feeling
- Instructions are at the top of your appointment slip
- Have your health card ready
- Ask your team if you need help













Family and Friends

- Visitor policies may change in order to keep everyone safe
- Ask your clinic team about the visitor policy
