CANCER CARE

When Sandy McBay was undergoing treatment for breast cancer, she appreciated the caring and supportive team at the Walker Family Cancer Centre and the opportunity to receive radiation therapy close to home. The opening of the cancer centre brought radiation treatment and other oncology services to Niagara for the first time.

CARDIAC CARE

The prospect of working at a modern facility with advanced technology heavily influenced Cardiologist Dr. Adnan Hameed's decision to join the Niagara Health team. The Cardiac Care program has significantly expanded its services and added new procedures in recent years due largely to the opening of the Heart Investigation Unit.

In Niagara since 2013:

8,750

cardiac catheterizations performed. This diagnostic procedure allows specialists to diagnose the severity of a patient's cardiac disease.

2,012

Percutaneous Coronary Interventions performed. This non-surgical procedure opens blood vessels in the heart to remove blockages.

MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTIONS

Nurse Practitioner Shahnawaz Ali takes great pride in being part of the Mental Health and Addictions care team that has grown by more than 100 since 2013. The program boasts the largest physical footprint in the hospital building and has introduced a number of new specialized programs, including services for patients requiring longer-term treatment in hospital and psychiatric emergency care.
