


VIOLENCE FLAG AND VIOLENCE PRECAUTION ORDERS

Violence Flag = Flag on banner bar under Alerts; indicating a person with potential for violence; stays on patient record from encounter to encounter.


*Can be placed in ED based on clinician's judgement; place violence risk flag through ED launchpoint; will not cross encounters

To place the alert on the chart in ED (launch point)


Right click on the patient's name for the 'context menu' and select 'Request Event', then click on the 'Violence Risk'



Once the violence flag is applied, it will be indicated below Patient's name as shown below



In **Acute setting**, Risk Management will complete the determination to place Violence Flag on patient chart. Nursing completes the VAT (score of 4 or above), completion of IRS documentation and an order for consult to Risk Management (required whenever IRS completed --IRS number is a mandatory field in consult to risk order)




For Risk Care specialist, Select Multi-Patient Task list and click on the consult to risk order.

TIP SHEET

HOSPITAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (HIS)

The Violence Assessment Tool (VAT) is an aid to assist in clinical evaluation and documentation of verbal and physical aggression towards others. This tool may be found as a section in the admission documentation PowerForm or as a PowerForm in an ADHOC file.

Score of 4 or greater will add an indicator to the patient chart in care compass- “hover to discover” the symbol’s meaning



*VAT score could indicate high due to a variety of circumstances and not always been an indicator for a Risk Management consult (i..e someone is in withdrawal).
